

# DATA AND DISPLACEMENT IN SÃO PAULO

---

As global displacement flows continue to increase, there is an urgent need to improve city-level analysis of refugee dynamics, needs, and investment strategies. São Paulo, in particular, as one of the principal mega-cities of Latin America, is also a hub for internal and regional displacement and international refugee movements. Public data collection systems on their own are not currently able to monitor and enable the effective management of these flows and their humanitarian consequences. Private data providers, including social media companies like Meta, telecommunications and remote sensing firms, and others, are now routinely producing high-quality data that can contribute significantly to migration-related public problem-solving.

UNHCR and CrisisReady are hosting a two-day workshop bringing together government representatives, international agencies, non-profits, private sector data providers, and academic researchers for targeted and collaborative problem-solving sessions addressing the challenges associated with data collection and analysis concerning refugee movements. Our goal is to foster the formation of networks among participants and promote collaboration to develop action protocols on the collection, analysis and use of data to inform on refugee dynamics and movement patterns, which can in turn help to shape decisions on city-level planning and resource allocation.
